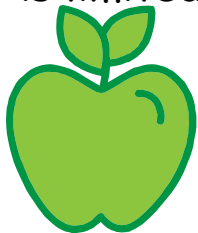


Courses

Summer School will be offered for **grades 3—8**. We will offer **Language Arts, Reading, Math, Social Studies, Science and CO-OP Preparation for the Catholic High School Entrance Exam**. All review and enrichment courses run for 1 hour and 30 minutes per session for a total of 40 hours each course. All subjects include homework. Each student is limited to two courses.

Curriculum

Fifth Grade Level Social Studies

Curriculum will encompass the study of the Americas Native Cultures and Colonization.

Sixth Grade Level Social Studies

Curriculum will encompass the study of World History—Early societies to the Modern World.

Seventh Grade Level Social Studies

Curriculum will encompass the study of U.S. History.

- Exploration of historical events of U.S. development from the 15th century to Reconstruction period of the 19th century.

Eighth Grade Level Social Studies

Curriculum will encompass the study of U.S. History from 1877 to Present.



Math

Goal is to provide opportunities for students to build their understanding of mathematical concepts and ample practice to master important skills. Most importantly, all concepts are taught through and practiced within a strong problem-solving environment insuring the students become life-long problem solvers.

Science

Students will explore in topics in Life, Earth, and Physical Science with an emphasis on inquiry, critical thinking and problems solving skills.

Literature

This courses is designed to strengthen comprehension, critical thinking, and vocabulary skills. Students will read poetry, short stores, and essays throughout the course.

Language Arts

This course is designed to strengthen grammar and writing mechanics. Students will explore a variety of writing styles throughout the course.

Tuition

All tuition is due at the time of registration. No students will be permitted into class if payments are not complete.

Each course is \$200.00 payable in cash. **NO PERSONAL CHECKS ACCEPTED.** No Refunds will be given.

The CO-OP Class Fee is \$125.00
